Bright Horizons Fund enables children from low-income families to receive quality pre-school education and positive classroom experiences.

As at June 2022, Bright Horizons Fund has touched the lives of 3,774 children through a range of financial support, learning, well-being and health & nutrition programmes.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAMMES



NTUC FIRST CAMPUS SPONSORED NTUC MEMBERSHIP PROGRAMME

2,441 Families

The programme provides NTUC membership to encourage eligible low-income families (one parent per family) to become members, so that these families can enjoy the various financial and employability benefits offered by NTUC. This privilege will continue till their child or youngest child leaves the NTUC First Campus' pre-school network.



OCBC-NTUC FIRST CAMPUS BRIDGING PROGRAMME

277 Children

This programme offers a one-time \$400 top-up to Child Development Accounts of eligible children from low-income families to ensure that pre-school education and healthcare remains accessible to them. Families eligible for the Baby Bonus Scheme also receive dollar-for-dollar matching from the Government. In May, OCBC also organised its first Financial Literacy Workshop for 2022, and 10 families participated in the workshop.

LEARNING PROGRAMMES



READ-TO-REACH PROGRAMME

189 Children

This small-group language and literacy intervention programme helps to raise the literacy levels of K1 children who have been identified as reading-at-risk.



CLASSROOM SUPPORT PROGRAMME

7 centres sponsored by CapitalLand Hope Foundation

541 Children

This programme provides additional in-class support for Nursery to K2 children with mild learning needs in language, literacy and numeracy. Small group activities are conducted to reinforce effective learning in the classroom and prepare children for their upcoming primary school journey. At at June 2022, 541 children benefitted from the Classroom Support Programme — of which, 174 children were sponsored through the support of CapitalLand Hope Foundation.

CAPITALAND-BRIGHT HORIZONS FUND READY-FOR-SCHOOL PROGRAMME



CapitaLand will be sponsoring an estimated 850 school bags with essentials for K2 graduating low-income children to better prepare them for their upcoming primary school journey.

In addition to the above, and in line with CapitalLand and NTUC First Campus' sustainability goals, CapitaLand will also be organising environmental sustainability-themed workshops for some of our children with the intention to educate them on Reducing Food Waste. Plans are underway to kickstart the workshops in Q3 2022. Watch this space for more updates!

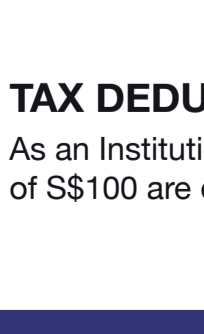

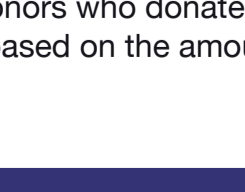

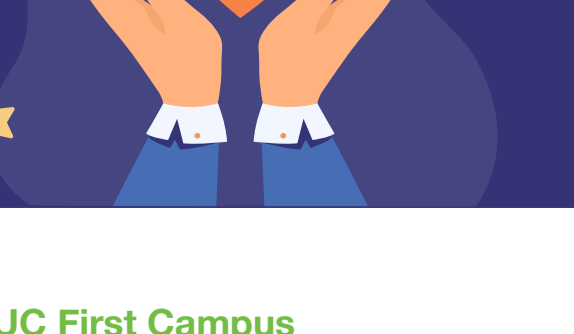
